FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Blessing in the wilderness experience.

We have read the book of Exodus for 14 days, from Jan 21- Feb 5, following the reading schedule of our *Bible Reading Plan 2022*. It is the story of the people of Israel and their journey in the wilderness toward the land that God promised to give them.

It is interesting to read that there were two different kinds of exodus experiences among them. First is their geographical exodus. They left Egypt physically, out of the land, out of the life of slavery. Second is their psychological exodus. Even though they left the land of slavery, they were still living in Egypt emotionally. They left Egypt with joy and thanksgiving to God. They danced together. However, whenever they faced a challenging situation, they grumbled against God, forgetting the hand of God that led them to the promised land. They complained to Moses, challenging his leadership, even threating to kill him.

I notice irony from their life experience in the wilderness. They left their old land of slavery in Egypt in body but they still lived in Egypt in mind. Their spiritual exodus from Egypt is challenged during their journey to the promised land.

But God trained them for forty years in the wilderness before they entered into the promised land. Forty years in the wilderness was for them to know God, to learn to trust God, to grow mature in relationship with God, to know God's provision, protection, and promise by experience.

Before Jesus began his public ministry, he was led by the Spirit to the wilderness, to be tempted by the devil (Matthew 4:1-11). He was tempted by the devil, fasting forty days and forty nights in the wilderness. But it was time for him to be shaped by the will of God, his Heavenly Father, the redemptive work of God for the world through him.

Following his example in the wilderness for forty days, Christian tradition has observed a season of Lent, a forty- day period, not counting Sundays, beginning on Ash Wednesday and lasting until Easter. It is a time for us to train ourselves to be more attentive to God, to practice spiritual discipline with Scripture reading with meditation, prayer, and service, remembering the Passion of Jesus Christ.

The season of Lent this year begins with Ash Wednesday on March 2. We will offer a worship service at 7:00 p.m. at the church. A Lenten devotional booklet is provided for you to practice daily prayer, Bible reading and meditation. During the Lenten season, we will continue to follow *Bible Reading Plan 2022*, by reading the book of Isaiah, the Gospel of Mark and John, to know the Passion of Jesus Christ.

May this season be a blessing to you.

GOOD NEWS REGARDING MEDIA MINISTRY UPGRADE

Bethany received a York River District Board of Missions grant for \$7500 in support of our media ministry upgrade at their annual meeting held February 6! We also celebrate the overwhelming success of the "Every Step Matters" financial campaign in which over \$15,000 was raised for the media upgrade! Please note that work has started in the area at the rear of the sanctuary where the new media desk and electronics will be housed. This work includes the raising of headers to facilitate the 8 inch platform that will be constructed by volunteers and located there so that the media team will have an unobstructed view of the sanctuary. The work to run additional power to that area will start February 15. In addition, the new media high-rise roll top desk is expected to be ordered soon. This desk will house the video and audio control electronics in a secure and attractive environment. We thank everyone for their support of this project and ask for your patience and understanding during the construction phases.

FAMILY MINISTRY NEWS – Volunteers are needed to energize and develop our Family Ministry. Please contact **Cathy Raines at 410-599-6493** if you are interested in helping, have ideas to share, or connections that we can use to get our message out into the community.

"Family ministry" is a term used to describe activities that churches offer to support family relationships. Placing priority on family is key, but a strong family ministry should be built on the foundation of partnering with parents, in addition to focusing on children and youth programs. I am committed to starting the following programs that are near and dear to my heart and need your help and support!

Single Parent Ministry - start initially with a single mom's support group (with daycare provided). Later on, as the group grows, I can see offering things such as financial literacy classes, family meal nights, home repair lunch and learn.

Foster Family Ministry – starting with an event in May (which is National Foster Care Month) that would allow foster parents to have a safe place to drop off kids in order to go to the food store, grab a meal, go shopping, or just take a long walk by themselves. This event could be a board game, movie or craft night, or a cooking class with dinner following!
