FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Bethany Town Hall Meeting

All Bethany members and friends, mark your calendar for Sunday, June 5, 4:00PM, and come to the Fellowship Hall. Why are we calling for this meeting? What is the goal of this gathering?

As United Methodists, we have been facing challenges and changes pertaining to the mission and ministries of the church, human sexuality, the inclusion of LGBTQ+ individuals, and our understanding of marriage.

Since the latest General Conference in 2016, and the special General Conference in 2019, these issues have been controversial among clergy and laity, and among the episcopal leadership of our denomination. To solve this conflict with a unified spirit, some proposals from various groups with different biblical and theological beliefs have been suggested to build the structure of the United Methodist Church, which the General Conference has the final authority to approve.

Due to the pandemic situation, however, the General Conference scheduled for 2020, has been postponed twice, and it has been rescheduled for 2024. After the announcement of the postponement of the General Conference until 2024, The Global Methodist Church (GMC) was formed as a new Methodist denomination beginning May 1, disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. The GMC holds traditional views on human sexuality as stated in the Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church, 2016.

How does this impact the life, mission, and ministry of Bethany church, here and now, and for the future? What is our call from God to discern the way we are going to follow? What would lead us to stay on focus amidst these controversial circumstances in the United Methodist Church?

I talked with our Lay Leader about this issue and we agreed to call for a Bethany Town Hall meeting to inform you of where we are in the United Methodist Church relating to this issue, and of proposals to the next General Conference. Our Town Hall meeting is called to create a safe space and place to speak, to listen, and to embrace each other's view in a loving, respectful environment. And our meeting is called for praying, discerning, and preparing for the decision that the General Conference would invite us to make in two years.

Mark your calendar, and come to join the Bethany Town Hall meeting. Bring with you prayer, love, and the grace of God through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

George Nelson Memorial Concert Series presents

Bagels & Fraylox Klezmer Band

Sunday, June 19 at 4:00 p.m.



Bagels & Fraylox is a Klezmer band from southeastern Virginia. Klezmer is a lively mixture of wedding and party music of 19th century Eastern Europe with strains of Yiddish theater and American dance band music of the early 1900s. But it borrows freely from gypsy tunes, Middle Eastern music and other sources as diverse as American folk music and rock 'n roll. All of those influences come out in Bagels & Fraylox concerts. A traditional wedding march from one hundred years ago in Russia or a schmaltzy tune from Yiddish theater - even Broadway's "Fiddler on the Roof" - may lead into a rock-flavored Middle Eastern rave-up that has audience members dancing in the aisles.

The Williamsburg-based band performs often at community cultural events and coffeehouses as well as weddings, bar mitzvahs and other parties. The ensemble features two clarinets, tenor saxophone, accordion, bass, drums and other percussion, as well as a vocalist.

To the Pastor and Congregation of Bethany Methodist Church;

The AARP Tax-Aide Program volunteers that staff this site thank you for the use of your facility for the past several months.

This tax season has been another one of challenges. In October when we began our planning the COVID virus was spreading quickly. The IRS and TaxAide Program management all set requirements on what procedures we had to follow. The Committee at Bethany Methodist saw the need for our service and allowed us to return to rooms in the church. Our required process was much like last year and required 3 visits to the church. One to receive the intake forms and set up a return appointment. Two; to return for scanning documents into the computer and to make another appointment to return and pick up the completed return. Councilors did the return at home during the week and then reviewed the return with the client the following week.

As you know, our normal process is based on in-person tax return preparation where the taxpayer and the councilors are together for the preparation and checking of the return. In spite of the required inefficiencies this year we were able to do 183 returns for 2021, 6 returns for 2020 and 1 return for 2018. As a measure of our success, the program is comparing returns done this year with the number done in 2019, pre-pandemic. Gloucester point was at 64%, our District 11 was at 57% and was best in the state of Virginia. Nationally the TaxAide Program helped with about 1 million returns, which is about half of pre-pandemic levels.

Our District 11 is the largest in the state in land area and the smallest in the number of volunteers and returns filed. We did tax returns this year at the Gloucester Court House Library, the Cryer Center in Deltaville, Immanuel Baptist Church in Saluda, Bethany Methodist Church and Mathews Library. The Court House crew does taxes on most Saturdays as well. Our site had people come from as far away as New Kent County. Shacklefords, Mathews County and York County.

We hope that by next year things will be closer to normal and look forward to continuing our service to local taxpayers and thank you again for the use of your facility.
