NOTE ON MUSIC FOR A PLATINUM JUBILEE

England’s Queen Elizabeth II may be small of stature, but she is a towering figure in modern royal history. When she reached 70 years on the throne on 6 February 2022, Elizabeth became the first British monarch to attain her “platinum” year and had already broken the record of the longest reigning British ruler in history, previously held by Queen Victoria who reigned from 1837 to 1901. Four days of lavish celebrations, known as the Platinum Jubilee, took place in London last weekend. They included a much anticipated appearance by the 96-year-old Queen on the balcony of Buckingham Palace followed by Trooping the Color, a military parade that has marked each sovereign’s office birthday since 1760.

Today at Bethany we shall celebrate Queen Elizabeth’s remarkable longevity with a selection of music by England’s finest composers, from the Renaissance to modern times. Our Voluntary is *Orb and Sceptre*, the march composed for Her Majesty’s coronation in 1953. The title alludes to the emblems of sovereignty that form the regalia of Great Britain. The “orb” is a globe surmounted by a cross – the globe symbolizing the Queen’s worldly dominion, the cross her Christian faith – and the “sceptre” is an ornamental wand fashioned of gold and precious stones. Sir William Walton’s music is very much in the tradition of the *Pomp and Circumstance* marches by Sir Edward Elgar, updated in style through the influence of jazz.

Our Offertory music harkens back to the “golden age” of Queen Elizabeth I, the daughter of King Henry VIII and Ann Boleyn, who reigned from 1558 to 1603. William Byrd, a contemporary of Shakespeare, was the greatest composer of the English Renaissance. Throughout a politically treacherous era, he remained in favor with the Anglican royal court, composing music for Protestant worship while also providing music for the liturgy of his own Catholic faith.

This morning’s opening Intrada transports us to a fireworks display on 21 April 1749 in the Vauxhall Gardens, a popular resort on the south bank of the River Thames. To celebrate the treaty of Aix-la-Chapelle that ended the War of the Austrian succession, King George II commissioned George Frideric Handel to compose accompanying music for large wind band. The fireworks fizzled, but Handel’s sizzling score has delighted audiences ever since!

MEDIA UPGRADE PROJECT UPDATE — Facebook Live is now up and running for our Sunday morning services. 135 Years of Bethany History

Did you know that Bethany's original brick parsonage still stands at what is now 2125 Hayes Road? The parsonage and furnishings, jointly owned by Bethany and Bethlehem, were sold to Bethlehem for \$7,500 in 1964 when Bethany became a station church. A new temporary parsonage, in the Tyndallmere Subdivision, was bought and furnished for about \$18,000. It is located just around the corner from our current parsonage, built in the early '70s.

George Nelson Memorial Concert Series presents
Bagels & Fraylox Klezmer Band — Sunday, June 19 at 4:00 p.m.



Klezmer is a lively mixture of wedding and party music of 19th century Eastern Europe with strains of Yiddish theater and American dance band music of the early 1900s. But it borrows freely from gypsy tunes, Middle Eastern music and other sources as diverse as American folk music and rock 'n roll. All of those influences come out in Bagels & Fraylox concerts. A traditional wedding march from one hundred years ago in Russia or a schmaltzy tune from Yiddish theater - even Broadway's "Fiddler on the Roof" - may lead into a rock-flavored Middle Eastern rave-up that has audience members dancing in the aisles.
