

#### NOTE ON MUSIC FOR BASTILLE DAY

July 14th is a national holiday of the French Republic, commemorating the fall of the Bastille prison in 1789 and the end of absolute monarchy. Today we celebrate this historical and cultural watershed with musical selections composed before and after the Revolution.

Our Offertory is the *Prelude* to Marc-Antoine Charpentier's *Te Deum* for eight solo singers, chorus, and orchestra. The text is a song of praise to God (see UMH No. 80). As a "Hymn of Thanksgiving," it has also been frequently sung at both religious and secular ceremonies, such as coronations and celebrations of victory in battle. Charpentier, one of the greatest masters of sacred music in 17<sup>th</sup>-century France, may have composed his *Te Deum* as a jubilant response to the French victory at Steinkerque on 3 August 1692. Among his other works is an opera based on the biblical story of David and Jonathan.

Although he eschewed celebrity and led a very modest life as a teacher and church organist, César Franck became the most influential composer in France during the last third of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. His power was transmitted not only through his works — among them such masterpieces as the *Symphony in D Minor* and *Three Chorales* for organ — but also through the advocacy of his students. Impressed by the simple goodness and personal charm of their mentor, Franck's disciples felt for him respect bordering on veneration and called him *Pater Seraphicus* ("seraphic father"). Franck considered his greatest achievement to be the oratorio *Les Béatitudes*, a setting of the Sermon on the Mount, although it never received a complete public performance during his lifetime. The failure of critics and audiences to appreciate it moved his once rebellious pupil Claude Debussy to praise Franck's "unique quality, simplicity. Unhappy and misunderstood as he was, he still had the heart of a child, so fundamentally good that he could, without a trace of bitterness, contemplate the wickedness of mankind and the perversity of things."

César Franck was born on 10 December 1822, and this year at Bethany we will celebrate his 200th birthday with a program of organ and piano music in the George Nelson Memorial Concert Series on Sunday, December 4th.
