MID-YEAR FINANCIAL UPDATE – The Finance Committee thanks everyone for your generosity during the first half of this year, especially for your support of the Media Upgrade project.

At mid-year (June 30th), budget income is 47% of the 2022 budget total of \$312,470. Some of the early offerings were the result of required individual IRA distributions sent directly to Bethany as a one-time yearly offering. We can't expect this dollar amount in the second half of the year. To meet the budget at year end, the average Sunday offering needs to be \$6,400.

With the economic slowdown and groceries and gas prices increasing, we realize these are tough times for our congregation. The Finance Committee will continue to monitor the budget and provide updates. – *Jack Whitmore*, Finance Chair

NOTE ON MUSIC FOR SAINT ANNE

Saint Anne is the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and her feast day is celebrated on July 26th. St. Anne is also the patron saint of housewives, women in labor, cabinet makers, and miners. Her emblem is a door, and her name derives from the Hebrew Hannah, meaning "grace."

Martin Luther's father was a miner, but sent his son to university in Erfurt to study law. Returning there from a visit home in July 1505, the future Reformer was almost struck by lightning and cried out, "Help, St. Anne! I will become a monk."

Saint Anne is also the name of the well-known English hymn tune to which *O God, Our Help in Ages Past* is usually sung. This melody is

attributed to William Croft (1678-1727), who was Organist of Saint Anne's Church in London at the time of its publication, circa 1708.

The custom of nicknaming J. S. Bach's *Fugue in E-flat Major*, BWV 552, "Saint Anne" seems to have originated in England, perhaps because the fugue subject is identical to the first seven notes of Croft's tune. Although this hymn tune appeared more than 30 years before the publication of Bach's masterpiece, there is no reason to suppose that the relationship is anything more than coincidental.

As a devout Christian, Bach also encoded theological concepts in his music, all of which is dedicated *Soli Deo Gloria*: "To God alone the glory!" The "St. Anne" Fugue exploits the number 3, symbolizing the Trinity. The key signature of E-flat major has three flats, and the entire Fugue is divided into three distinct sections, each with its own subject personifying the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. The Three Persons-in-One dance together as Bach's sublime Fugue reaches its grand finale!

135 Years of Bethany History

Did you know that on the evening of Saturday, January 16, 1982, the original Bethany church building was completely destroyed by a devastating fire?

It is believed that the origin of the fire was due to the partially clogged flue opening from the furnace to the chimney, causing hot gases and intense heat to build up between the chimney and its adjacent wall. Two Mormon missionaries noticed the billowing, black smoke pouring from the eaves of the church and notified a resident of the mobile home court nearby, who then called the Dispatcher's Office at 8:52 p.m.
