FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Bethany's New Normal

A year ago at this time, when the COVID-19 pandemic was still strongly impacting us, I called for Bethany Leadership Group Formation, to facilitate how we prepare for the mission and ministry of the church during and after the pandemic time. Our goal was to meet for prayer, discernment and planning, and reading a book, *The Post Quarantine Church*, written by Thom S. Rainer, a church consultant and author of several books. Twelve to fourteen leaders of the church met weekly via Zoom for seven weeks. The report of this group was shared in our September 2021 church newsletter, and shared with ministry groups as well. The report is posted again in the *Bethany Banner* this month. Please read it so that you may see a vision of mission and ministry of Bethany through and after the pandemic time, and what a new normal would be like in the life of our church.

This year, our new normal begins with our thanksgiving to God as we celebrate our anniversary on September 18th. Bethany has witnessed to God for 135 years serving people and the community. Our celebration begins on August 28th with one of our own former members, ordained pastor Rev. Christina M. Hart-Perkins, as the guest preacher for worship. On September 18th, former Bethany pastor, Rev. Debbie Marion, will preach the sermon during our worship service. Afterwards we will gather for a covered-dish luncheon in the fellowship hall. Our anniversary team has planned for other programs and activities, which are listed in this month's newsletter.

Digital ministry is going to be a new normal at Bethany. We have planned to upgrade audio/visual tools to extend ministry not only to our congregation but also the community. As of this month, our audio system has been upgraded and our video system is projected to be completed by the middle of September, with new digital displays — two in the front and one in the back, with computerized system—to replace our current standing screen. With upgraded digital tools, we are able to livestream our worship, and to improve our ministries in person, as well as virtually, in all age groups.

Two Sunday worship services will be our new normal. Before the pandemic, Bethany church used to offer two worship services on Sunday. Our new

normal will be different in terms of worship. Beginning in September, with the exception of September 18, we will offer two different styles of worship — informal worship at 8:30 a.m., traditional worship at 11:00 a.m., with weekly Sunday school for all ages at 9:45 am. Our vision is to reach out to more diverse people so that they can come to the style of worship that they prefer. It is for missional purposes that we will return to two worship services in different styles.

Based on our discernment during Bethany Leadership Formation, we continue to see where God is leading us, to new challenges and opportunities, for the new normal to which we are called to respond faithfully, trusting that the life, mission, and ministry of Bethany is upon God. Glory be to God.

MID-YEAR FINANCIAL UPDATE – The Finance Committee thanks everyone for your generosity during the first half of this year, especially for your support of the Media Upgrade project.

At mid-year (June 30th), budget income is 47% of the 2022 budget total of \$312,470. Some of the early offerings were the result of required individual IRA distributions sent directly to Bethany as a one-time yearly offering. We can't expect this dollar amount in the second half of the year. To meet the budget at year end, the average Sunday offering needs to be \$6,400.

With the economic slowdown and groceries and gas prices increasing, we realize these are tough times for our congregation. The Finance Committee will continue to monitor the budget and provide updates.
