FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Your voices were heard.

Since last September, in our Bethany Leadership Group, we have prayed for the ministry of the church after the COVID-19 pandemic. One of the plans for ministry was to return to offering two worship services on Sunday, which would be different from our two services of pre-pandemic time. We envisioned a new Informal worship service at 8:30 a.m. We have prayed for it and plan to begin the new service beginning this September, and we have announced it to the congregation.

Since we made the announcement of two services on Sunday, church members and friends sent me their opinions. These are some comments that were expressed.

"I have enjoyed one service on Sunday at 10:00. I am comfortable with it."

"I like one service because I can see more people."

"To me, two services look like we have two different congregations on Sunday."

"Bethany is not big enough to need two separate services. We are a small congregation."

"I like traditional music and hymns, and I don't like the changing of it."

"Sometimes, I don't know the name of people at worship; asking their name is embarrassing to me. When we have two services, it would be more embarrassing."

At the same time, many expressed positive comments and anticipation for the new informal service.

I want to thank you all who have talked with me about our new informal service. I understand how you feel, your hopes and fears, comments and concerns about two worship services on Sunday. Your voices were heard. At the same time, I want to express our vision of offering two services in different styles and formats.

Why two services on Sunday with one of them informal style? Traditional church growth strategy suggests that when church pews are 80 percent filled on Sunday, it is time to add a new worship service or expand the sanctuary. Our vision is, however, a proactive action in that we will begin a new style of worship to reach out to more diverse people while we continue to have our current traditional worship service with no change, except to move it to 11:00 a.m. on Sunday morning.

For us to continue to enjoy our fellowship with each other, we will begin a new fellowship time, "Coffee and Donuts," between the two services. This will take place in the fellowship hall, name badges provided, and we will celebrate birthdays and anniversaries, and share prayer concerns, before the Sunday school hour.

The COVID-19 virus pandemic has forced us to make changes in life, challenging the mission and ministry of the church. It has also given us opportunities to learn how to respond to God creatively, effectively, and faithfully. As humans, we usually feel discomfort at any change, big or small, individually and collectively as well. God has led us through the virus pandemic and we give thanks to God. God will continue to lead us toward a new normal, new opportunity, as we put our whole trust in God, diligently discerning what God would accomplish in and through us, with faithful and thankful hearts.

MUSIC NEWS: SHACKELFORD WORKS IN THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS

The musical works composed and transcribed by Bethany's Organist, Rudy Shackelford, have been accepted for the permanent collection of The Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. Established in 1800, The Library of Congress is the national library of America, and its Music Division serves as an archive of the country's leading composers. Two of Rudy Shackelford's compositions, *Trumpet Voluntary* and *Charles Wesley Organbook*, were created to celebrate Bethany's 110th and 120th anniversaries in 1997 and 2007, respectively, and are published by Paraclete Press. For Bethany's 135th anniversary, Rudy has transcribed for organ-piano duet the finale of *String Quartet No. 16*, Opus 135, by Ludwig van Beethoven. The world première of this transcription will be performed during the worship service on September 18th. It will also be part of Rudy Shackelford's annual recital in the George Nelson Memorial Concert Series at Bethany on Sunday, December 4th.
