FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

New Beginnings.

October this year is a month for Bethany church to experience new beginnings.

We begin to read the New Testament this month. Following the schedule of our Bethany Bible Reading Plan, 2022, we have read through all books of the Old Testament by the end of September, the Law, History, Prophets, and Wisdom. We have read the story of how God made a covenant with the people God called, and how they lived out the covenant differently in different walks of their lives, and how God continued to lead them with steadfast love, *hesed*, in each walk and amidst changing circumstances, giving them hope of the messianic kingdom.

As we begin reading the New Testament, we are going to see how God's Old Covenant is fulfilled in Jesus Christ, how he established a New Covenant, new hope, through his life, teaching, death, and resurrection, and through the life of the church.

We begin to write a new chapter of Bethany history after having celebrated our 135th anniversary on September 18, giving thanks for the life, mission, and ministry of the church. The Anniversary committee members worked hard, and their efforts and service were fruitful. We had a wonderful celebration including worship with special music, fellowship with many people, and a generous potluck luncheon. We were glad to see members and friends that we have not seen for a long time.

We begin a new Sunday schedule with two Sunday worship services in different forms and styles, informal and traditional, so that we can reach out to diverse people in the community. "Coffee & Donuts" in the fellowship hall is a time to meet people from each worship service and for all to enjoy fellowship with each other, singing "Happy Birthday" to those celebrating birthdays that week, followed by Sunday school for all age groups.

We begin to worship using upgraded audio/video equipment. Our upgrade was completed the third week of September, providing us with advanced technology and livestreaming capability.

We begin a new faith group, "Joshua Spiritual Formation Group." It is ten-month course for all who want to grow deeper in faith and Christian spirituality so that we may know God by experience, to love God and love our neighbors.

What other new beginnings do you know of at Bethany? Please list them, give thanks to God, and share with each other.

My final thought is this: It is God who brings forth a new beginning in and through the church. To the people in despair for their sin and unfaithfulness, the prophet Isaiah spoke for God,

"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland." (Isaiah 43:18-19)

The new things God does are for life to be forgiven, restored, and to be strengthened. This prophetic vision calls us to be faithfully attentive to what God is doing in and through the church, and to see how God will lead us to accomplish the purpose and goals through the church, as we diligently discern, "God, what are you calling us to become?" "God, what are you calling us to do?"

Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Philippi, and we read it today too as a church that sees new beginnings happening in and around us,

"Continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose." (Philippians 2: 12b-13).

Now we need the help of our Bethany family. How? By completing the Faith Promise form in this month's newsletter.

Faith Promise giving is a vital part of the budget process because it is one of the tools used to project income for the coming budget year. Faith Promises are allocated to the General Fund and used for routine operational expenses (water, electricity, general maintenance, insurance, pastor and staff salaries, advertising, supplies, etc.) needed to provide effective ministry to our church and community. Like so many organizations, Bethany's income and expenses have been impacted in these challenging times, yet the need for ministry and outreach is more important than ever.

Please take a few minutes and prayerfully consider your general fund Faith Promise for 2023, and return your completed form by October 7. This will give us time to complete and submit the budget for approval by the Finance Committee and Administrative Council prior to our scheduled Charge Conference on October 30th.
