

RALPH VAUGHAN WILLIAMS: AN APPRECIATION By Rudy Shackelford



One of the most vital creative forces in 20th-century music was the composer Ralph Vaughan Williams, born on 12 October 1872 in Down Ampney, Gloucestershire, England. He died in London on 26 August 1958.

Although fully educated in the classics of Cambridge University and the Royal College of Music, Vaughan Williams valued English folksong as the most salutary influence on his work. It strongly shaped the choices he made as editor of the *English Hymnal* (1906), which incorporated such secular tunes as *Kingsfold* (UMH Nos. 179,

286, and 606); Forest Green (152, 539, and 709); King's Weston (168 and 592); and the Sussex Carol (642). Vaughan Williams also composed several original hymn tunes that have found a permanent place in Protestant hymnals worldwide and are considered to be among the most singable modern melodies: Hail Thee, Festival Day (UMH No. 324); Come Down, O Love Divine (475); God Be with You till We Meet Again (673); and For All the Saints (711, also 166). Prominent among Vaughan Williams' other contributions to sacred music are the ballet Job, the Revelation oratorio Sancta Civitas (The Holy City), and the opera based on John Bunyan's Pilgrim's Progress.

For his achievements in the realm of symphonic music, Ralph Vaughan Williams deserves a place of honor alongside Beethoven, Schubert, Dvořák, Bruckner, and Mahler, who all composed nine symphonies. Both the first, subtitled *A Sea Symphony*, and the cantata *Dona Nobis Pacem* set to music the poetry of Walt Whitman. *A London Symphony* (No. 2) vividly portrays life in the English capital, including the chimes of Big Ben. Vaughan Williams alludes to Beethoven with his *Pastoral Symphony* (No. 3), which ends with the haunting chant of a wordless soprano voice. From the music he wrote for the film *Scott of the Antarctic*, Vaughan Williams carved out his *Sinfonia Antartica* (No. 7), featuring a chilling part for wind machine!

I hope that your brief encounter with this fascinating composer in today's service will inspire you to explore his music in depth. To celebrate the sesquicentennial of his birth, WHRO-fm radio is broadcasting a wealth of Vaughan Williams, whose first name is pronounced "Rayfe." **ALTAR FLOWERS** are given by Steve and Dee Dee Wike with thanksgiving for all God's blessings. *We offer you these flowers to take and share with someone in need of encouragement this week.*
