By the grace, love, and mercy of God, the life, mission, and ministry of Bethany UMC have been done faithfully. I am thankful to God for the past year, and to the Bethany congregation for building up the church together with me, participating in its ministry by prayer, presence, gifts, service, and by witness, fulfilling the call from God. It has been a year of joy to me and my family...

In my second year serving the church, I have continued to focus on attentiveness and responsiveness to God's call in the life of the church, while I continue to strive to grow in contemplative life and ministry. I have seen much blessing from God in the past year for myself, my family, but also for the overall life of Bethany church with fruitfulness, while we are still living under the continued impact of the COVID virus pandemic. I confess that God's love, grace and mercy have held us up strong. Here are highlights of the ministry at Bethany church.

Ministry of prayer and presence — Praying, individually and corporately, has been a source of guidance, wisdom and strength. I begin each day with prayer, intercessory prayer for the congregation, and contemplative prayer. The ministry of presence has been in attending church meetings, group gatherings, and pastoral visitation either by request or on schedule.

Ministry of worship and preaching — Worship is the integral part of the spiritual life of the church. "Spiritual vitality" has been my focal point of building a worship liturgy. Following up on Bethany's leadership gathering last year, we began an informal worship service on Sundays, starting in September of this year, to reach out to people with diverse needs. Traditional and Informal services are now offered at Bethany church. A/V technology has been a tool for both worship services since the completion of our A/V project in September, when we began livestreaming our traditional service. With new worship schedules, Sunday school for all ages now takes place between the two services, and nursery care is provided as well. My preaching has been aligned with liturgical seasons as well as church initiatives and world events, following the lectionary in the Lenten and Advent seasons, following our Bible reading plan 2022, and offering three topical sermon series: "Post-Resurrection Messages" in the spring, "The Work of the Holy Spirit" in the summer, and "New Normal after COVID-19 Pandemic" in the fall.

Ministry of spiritual formation — Bible Reading Plan 2022 has been a congregational campaign of daily Bible reading following a printed schedule, beginning in January and reading all books of the Bible through December. Information and transformation are spiritual sign posts for this Bible reading campaign. Our Joshua Spiritual Formation Group began meeting in September for a ten-month period. Its goal is deepening spirituality in life individually and cooperatively, and strengthening spiritual leadership in each participant. I continue to grow in my own spiritual formation through enrollment in a graduate level certificate program in Spiritual Theology at St Mary's University and Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland.

Ministry of small group --- Confirmation class was offered this past spring, and Bethany church confirmed 7 youths who professed their faith. The Lenten Bible Study, "24 Hours that Changed the World," was offered during the Lenten season. VBS was offered with the theme of "Rocky Railway" in August.

Bethany Town Hall meeting was a congregational gathering on June 5, for listening to the diverse voices on human sexuality, which has been an issue at the general church level in the United Methodist Church as we are waiting for the General Conference, scheduled for 2024. As a follow up to this initial gathering, I plan to offer another meeting to inform our Bethany congregation of updates, with Bible study, so that members and friends can continue to discern about this issue, spiritually, biblically, and prayerfully.

Ministry of mission and outreach— Local missions outreach has continued during the virus pandemic, reaching out to people or groups in the community by congregational or ministry groups. By generous giving of the Bethany congregation, totaling \$5,965.88 year to date, the Pastor's Discretionary Fund has helped 37 families of the community in need of rent, utilities, and emergency housing assistance.

"Volunteers in Mission" has not been active during the pandemic, and we continue to pray and plan for organizing this team for the coming year.

Connectional ministry has been done faithfully this year. Bethany is one of the churches in the Annual Conference that has given 100% of its apportionments during this financially challenging year. We will continue to support an overseas missionary for next year while we look for information from the annual conference or General Board of Global Ministries.

Music Camp was a pilot program this past summer in July, teaching musical instruments to children and youth in the community. We received a special grant of \$2,000 from the Common Table Connectional Ministry of the Annual Conference for this camp. It was successfully done under the leadership of director Sandy Byrd and volunteers.

The George Nelson Concert series offered music programs for the community – Streets of Gold Gospel Quartet, May 15; Courthouse Community Orchestra, May 25; Bagels and Fraylox Klezmer Band, June 19; Bill & Pam Gurley Concert, August 21.

Our Homebound Ministry volunteers continue to cook meals monthly to feed the elderly and shut-ins. Bethany has continued hosting two annual blood drives.

Ministry of property and building — The Church building and parsonage has been well-cared for by the faithful work of Trustee members and volunteers. We thank them for their work to maintain and keep up the church property. Our media upgrade has been completed in the sanctuary, with wiring connecting it to the nursery room, fellowship hall, and one classroom. This project was supported by funds from the York River District Board of Missions, our congregational campaign, and by the work of Winter Sound and Lee Hartman & Sons.

Bethany church celebrated its 135th Anniversary on Sept. 18, 2022, with 135 people attending worship. We give thanks to God who has blessed Bethany church, its life, mission, and ministry for the past years. And we put our trust in the same God who will continue to bless and lead us in the future.



GEORGE NELSON MEMORIAL CONCERT SERIES

The George Nelson Memorial Concert Series will present a concert by acoustic soloist Timothy Seaman on Sunday, November 6 at 4:00 p.m.



A proud native of West Virginia, Timothy has lived in Virginia since 1956 and in Williamsburg since 1970. An English graduate of the College of William & Mary, a four-summer backpacking instructor as a Philmont Ranger, and a veteran of nineteen years of school teaching, he has continually been involved in music and has made it his sole endeavor since 1994.

Timothy brings together an eclectic blend of music styles unlike any other: sometimes the deep voice of his four-octave extended-range hammered dulcimer takes on the heart of a Chopin ballade, and at other times the festivity of an oldtime mountain dance or a glistening contemporary interpretation of a whitewater canoe ride or a highland hike among fir trees. His bamboo or silver flute improvisations and passionate folk renditions leave the air glowing with meaning --- and then the bowed psaltery or the crafted vocal carries one's mood into yet another exploration.

A specialist in Virginia themes, nature, parks, Celtic roots and folk hymns, Timothy has since 1978 produced or co-produced nineteen recordings totaling 131,000 copies, including the well-received *Here on This Ridge*, for Shenandoah National Park; *Celebration of Centuries*, for his home town Williamsburg's tricentennial; *Sycamore Rapids*, featuring the hammered dulcimer in "adventures out among the trees of Virginia's Parks and Forests;" *Virginia Wildlife*, for the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries; *Jamestown: On the Edge of a Vast Continent*, for the 400th commemoration; *Cleansing Fountain*, folk hymn interpretations for the Blue Ridge Parkway; a set of lyrical melodies called *Celtic Airs*; and the recent release for the Civil War Sesquicentennial entitled *Tenting on the Old Camp Ground*. Although many tracks on these CDs are full ensemble arrangements (often with all instruments played by Seaman himself), they carry the same variety and flow of thought that characterize his solo presence.

At a Seaman concert, expect to be exhilarated, amused, awed, surprised, personally involved (maybe singing a chorus or playing along on an Irish bodhran drum or Thai frog), and enriched by real substance. Timothy introduces every selection with stories, fascinating details, and word pictures to form a vivid context with humor, history, drama, science, and color. Come and find traditional, newly composed, and Baroque music that reviewers have referred to as "soul-to-soul" and "highly lyrical."
