135 YEARS OF BETHANY HISTORY

Did you know that for many years C. David Burke (d. 2006) was treasurer of Bethany Church as well as treasurer of Gloucester County?

His wife, Ella Gray Burke (d. 2004), a Bethany Sunday School teacher, was employed as a teacher in the Gloucester County school system.

Their home overlooking the York River (next to VIMS) was the setting for many Vacation Bible School picnics in the fifties and early sixties.
