## **135 YEARS OF BETHANY HISTORY**

Did you know that of the 42 pastors at Bethany, 9 served longer than the customary 4 years for most Methodist ministers?

They were: Braxton Allport, Jr., Norman E. Hunt, Thomas G. Lee, Jr., A. W. Linthicum, Donald H. Seely, and Stephen Young = 5 years; Linwood Daniel and J. W. Lilliaston = 6 years; and Arthur W. Ayers = 10 years.

#### NOTE ON MUSIC FOR ADVENT

Our instrumental music for the first Sunday of Advent is based on the hymn *Wake, Awake, for Night Is Flying* (UMH No. 720). The stirring tune was composed by Hans Sachs, the 16<sup>th</sup>-century shoemaker and singer made famous by Richard Wagner's 1867 comic opera *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg*. The text, written around 1599 by the German poet and theologian Philipp Nicolai, deals first with the parable of the wise and foolish virgins (*Matthew* 25: 1-13), then turns to a description of heavenly Zion (*Isaiah* 52: 8).

In 1731 Johann Sebastian Bach composed an Advent cantata based on this hymn, *Wachet auf*, *ruft uns die Stimme* in the original German. He then extracted the brief chorale prelude for organ which we present as today's Meditation in the piano transcription by Ferruccio Busoni. In this celebrated piece, Bach has written mystical wedding music of a truly bridal intimacy. "Zion," symbolized by the chorale, "hears the watchman singing," whose love melody sometimes sounds nearer, sometimes farther away, like an echo.

Our Offertory is a fugue based on *Wachet auf...* (or *Wake, Awake...*) composed by Hugo Distler, one of the brightest lights in German evangelical church music during the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Distler was deeply involved in synthesizing ancient forms of liturgical music and organ building ideals with modern conceptions of tonality, rhythm, and thematic development into a style which was not "art for art's sake" but art in the service of the Protestant church.

Tragically, Hugo Distler's mission and his brilliant potential remained unfulfilled, for on 1 November 1942 (All Saint's Day) he committed suicide. Anxiety over being forced to serve in Hitler's army, the Nazi party's war against the church, and frustration resulting from insufficient time for creative activity may have contributed to Distler's untimely demise. But he will always be remembered for a handful of organ and choral masterpieces whose musical integrity and spiritual depth transcend their time.
