Appalachian Winter, created by Joseph M. Martin and narrated by Clair Hillard, will be performed by Bethany's Chancel Choir on December 18 at 10:00 a.m.

This cantata celebrates the legacy of early American carols and hymnody.

Composed in the spirit of folk music, it combines traditional sounds with more rustic elements creating a blend that is fresh and pleasing. Popular American carols like "Away In A Manger" and "O Little Town Of Bethlehem" dance with traditional spirituals such as "Children, Go Where I Send Thee" and "Go Tell It On The Mountain."

Sacred Harp tunes are re-tooled for Advent and stand alongside new versions of Shaker hymns and Appalachian melodies. Thoughtful narration weaves the movement together in a meaningful tapestry of song and scripture.

CELEBRATING CÉSAR FRANCK AT 200!

"Render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's."

— Matthew 22:21

Today in morning worship (11 A.M.) and afternoon concert (4 P.M.), Bethany UMC joins a global chorus to render unto César Franck the praise he so richly deserves for his splendidly spiritual music and unto God our profound thanks for this creation.

Born 200 years ago on 10 December 1822 in Liège, Belgium, César Franck soon revealed himself as a child prodigy whose talent was compared to Mozart's. His family moved to France when he was fourteen so that César could enter the prestigious Paris Conservatory of Music, where he won every academic honor. Prepared to conquer the world's concert halls as a piano virtuoso, Franck's humble and introverted personality inclined him instead to the career of a church musician. In 1857 he was fortunate to be appointed organist of the new Basilica of Sainte-Clotilde, a post he held until his death 33 years later. The magnificent pipe organ Aristide Cavaillé-Coll created for this church inspired Franck's revolutionary music. When asked about it, the composer exclaimed: "My new organ? It is an orchestra!" In addition to his twelve masterworks for organ, César Franck wrote music for chamber ensembles and symphony orchestra and a choral setting of Christ's "Sermon on the Mount."

This morning's Meditation is Franck's *Pastorale*, a charming genre piece depicting rural life and landscapes in the *Gospel according to St. Luke*. It will be performed once again in the afternoon program of the George Nelson Memorial Concert Series, together with the *Heroic Piece*, a hymn of spiritual triumph; *Prelude, Fugue and Variation* in Franck's own transcription for organ-piano duet; and *Three Chorals*, the last great testament of a composer who has been called "the French Bach."

The afternoon concert also features our organ-piano duet transcription of the finale from Beethoven's *String Quartet No. 16*, Opus 135, first performed on September 18^{th} to celebrate Bethany's 135^{th} anniversary.
