Bethany Town Hall Meetings.

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church is the top administrative and legislative body of our denomination. It meets every four years, updating the *Book of the Discipline* which contains our Constitution, Doctrine, General Rules, and Social Principles. Since its meeting in 2016, the General Conference has been postponed because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and finally its meeting is scheduled for April, 2024. While we are waiting for the next General Conference to discuss human sexuality, marriage, and ordination, we are called to pray for God's will and to be faithfully attentive to the work of God through these issues and processes.

At Bethany church, we have called town hall meetings. The first meeting was in October of last year. Its purpose was to listen to each other's voices attentively and respectfully regarding these issues. We set a ground rule during the meeting that each person speaks his/her own opinion for three to five minutes while the rest of the people listen with no reaction, correction, or judgment. Then all people remain silent for a minute to digest the speaker's opinion and point before the next person speaks. Listening, speaking, and understanding was a group dynamic we practiced without making any decision, petition, or resolution regarding the issue.

On December 12, 2022, I met with some key leaders of Bethany church sharing recent denominational information which has been posted on the UMC's website as well as on the Virginia Annual Conference website, pertaining to the beginning of the Global Methodist Church, proposition 2553, which is the process of disaffiliation from the UMC. I shared with the key leaders, listening to their opinions on this information as it relates to Bethany church. It was only an informational meeting for our discernment.

On January 15, 2023, the second Bethany town hall meeting was called. Our purpose for the second meeting was to read Scripture passages referring to human sexuality and to study chapter seven, "Homosexuality," in the book, *Confronting the Controversies: Biblical Perspective On Tough Issues*, written by Rev. Adam Hamilton. We read the Scripture, watched his presentation with different views, both traditional and progressive, on this issue, and discerned what we are called to practice during this confronting time. Our goal for the second town hall meeting was to help each individual find his/her own faith conscience on this issue, and Christian virtue to practice.

As we are waiting for General Conference next year, we may be anxious about what it will mean for the mission and ministry of the United Methodist Church, both personally and communally. We will continue our Bethany town hall meetings as needed, to stay informed regarding these issues as pertains to the mission and ministry and to the future of Bethany church, and we will continue to pray that we may discern the will of God and be attentive to God's work in and through us.

The primary call during this time, I believe, is to stand firm in the faith and trust in God, Jesus Christ our Lord. To a church struggling with controversy, the Apostle Paul wrote, "Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong. **Do everything in love.**" (1 Corinthians 16: 13-14)
