Easter is an Everyday Event.

Easter, the day of Resurrection of the Lord Jesus, comes every year in our annual liturgical season.

Again, this year, we welcome it by decorating the altar, offering special programs and activities at the church, and inviting family members and friends to come celebrate Easter together.

Let's ponder on this. If we celebrate Easter merely one day a year, then we are thinking of Easter as chronos, which is time measured and counted, like any other day coming and passing naturally. If we celebrate Easter, however, as an daily event, and so as an ongoing opportunity in life for us to reaffirm and grow in our love for God and others, it is understanding Easter as Kairos, the appointed time in the purpose of God to be lived and experienced.

According to the Gospel of Luke, the message of the first Easter is proclaimed, "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" (Luke 24:5).

Jesus Christ is risen. He is risen today indeed. The risen Lord is with us always, today, tomorrow, and every day. He calls us to live each day by the power of resurrection, calling us to rise from the power of darkness and death, from the power of sinfulness, and from the sin-sick soul to life living in the joy and the hope of resurrection.

Apostle Paul puts it this way:

"The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus." (Romans 6:10-11)

"I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." (Galatians 2:20)

Easter as Kairos is an event happening in us every day by the Power of the Holy Spirit. It is to die to sin and to live to righteousness of God each day.

May the power of the hope of resurrection keep you through.



GEORGE NELSON MEMORIAL CONCERT SERIES

On **Sunday, May 7 at 4 PM,** the George Nelson Memorial Concert Series will be presenting an incredible performance by the Virginia Handbell Consort.



On September 22, 1996, an announcement appeared in the local newspaper stating, "handbell group looks for ringers." Forty people answered the call to audition. Founder Tex Minter chose 18 ringers who became charter members for the new Virginia Handbell Consort. The ensemble started with ambitious goals that included a full schedule of nine Christmas concerts and took the huge step of purchasing a 5-octave set of Schulmerich Bells and a 3-octave set of chimes. Twenty-eight concerts were performed in the first year and lots of fundraisers were held in order to pay for this initial investment.

Today, VHC owns:

- 6 octaves of Schulmerich bells
- 4 additional octaves of Schulmerich bells
- 3 octaves of Petit and Fritsen bells
- 7 octaves of Malmark and Schulmerich chimes
- Percussion equipment that includes wind chimes, wood blocks, triangles, cymbals, etc.

In the twenty-five years VHC has been a performing ensemble, 253 pieces of music have been performed and 75 ringers have been members.
