



Virtual worship.

On Saturday evening, January 21, I had massive internal bleeding with no pain and some outward symptoms, and I went to the ER at a local hospital, experiencing more episodes. The ER doctor made an order for me to be transferred to the hospital in Richmond to get more specialized care. On early Sunday morning while I was waiting for transfer to Richmond, Kim texted to inform our Lay leader Judy, and our church office administrator, Dee Dee of my condition, and to ask them to cover me for Sunday worship services.

On Sunday morning from my hospital bed, I joined Bethany in worship, both informal and traditional. I felt thankful to God for relieving me from worsening symptoms and for being able to worship on Sunday. I saw Judy, Dee Dee, and Doe, who is one of Bethany's Lay Servants, leading the congregation in worship that was spirit-led and done in cooperation. I saw intercessory prayers offered by the congregation in the pews and at the communion rail. I felt deeply the presence of God in worship, God working through people in worship. Also, I felt the concerns and love I received from the congregation in worship, and that Kim and I were blessed by the Bethany congregation.

The following Sunday, after being discharged from the hospital on Wednesday, January 25, while I was recuperating, I again joined virtual worship at home, when the District Superintendent of the Mission River District sent a District Lay Servant to cover me in the pulpit.

Kim and I thank our Bethany church family and church leadership for your prayers, love and support during my illness. Your thoughts, prayers, prayer cards and shawls, and encouragement have led us to know by experience who we are in the Bethany church family. I am thankful that God has led Bethany church to do his mission and ministry through upgrading audio/visual equipment for the past two years, which has enabled us to offer virtual worship to all who are not able to attend in person worship. Your vision and commitment made it possible to reach out to the community virtually using technology.

My time in illness was an opportunity to know the love of God, the love of people, and thankfulness.

My prayer goes to you that this Lenten season will be a time to get closer to God.

COMMUNITY FORUM ON DRUG ISSUES TO BE HELD AT BETHANY, Wednesday, March 15, 7 PM

Misuse of prescription and illicit drugs has become more prominent in our community. Regardless of age or vocation, anyone can become addicted, even though young people are more at risk. The quality of illicit drugs is consistently undependable and increases the risk of overdose. Less expensive and readily available chemicals may be added to more costly drugs, increasing the risk of a potentially fatal reaction.

Bethany UMC will host a community forum on Wednesday, March 15, to give our church family and neighbors the opportunity to hear information and ask questions about this ongoing health and social dilemma. The Director, a Counselor, and a Nurse from the American Addiction Treatment Center will give a short presentation and be available to answer questions. Their goal is to heighten our awareness and sensitivity to the problem, as well as direct us to sources of local assistance available for those who are struggling with this issue, whether that is you or someone you love. All are welcome to attend, including youth directors, teachers, parents, students, healthcare providers, and concerned citizens.

BETHANY BANNER PUBLICATION AND DELIVERY CHANGES

After much prayer and discussion by the Communications Committee and Administrative Council, the decision has been made to discontinue bulk-mailing the monthly newsletter, *Bethany Banner*, beginning with the April issue. **The March issue will be the final issue distributed by mail.**The newsletter will still be published monthly and made available on our website and via email blast. **Printed copies will be available <u>at church</u>** for those who still wish to read a good old-fashioned hard copy. Shut-ins will receive a copy via first-class mail, along with their bulletin.

Many factors were considered in reaching this decision, including the many methods we currently communicate with our church family, community, Mission Rivers District, and Virginia Annual Conference (such as the weekly Sunday bulletin, twice-weekly email blast, church sign, brochures, local print media, voicemail message, website, Bethany's Facebook page, and the district e-newsletter); the increasing cost of postage, supplies, and staff labor to produce, print, and prepare the newsletter for mailing; and the ongoing challenge of ensuring timely delivery. Most of the newsletter content is a duplication of information communicated through the channels mentioned above, so even if you don't read the *Banner*, you still have access to current information about our activities and services.

We realize that change is difficult and that old habits die hard, and we appreciate your continued support during this transition. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me in the church office.

THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS ACQUIRES SHACKELFORD MANUSCRIPTS

The Library of Congress in Washington, D. C., has accepted manuscripts of music composed and transcribed by Rudy Shackelford for its permanent collection of American music.

Shackelford's published works for organ, harpsichord, and guitar are already part of the Library's vast holdings, as are letters Shackelford received from Luigi Dallapiccola, the leading Italian composer after World War II. This correspondence concerns Shackelford's organ transcription of *Annalibera's Musical Notebook*, a piano suite Dallapiccola wrote to celebrate his daughter's birthday. The Library of Congress commissioned several works from Dallapiccola, who visited America often during the 1950s and 1960s as guest professor of composition at universities and music festivals.

Rudy Shackelford has composed works for the Alard String Quartet, the Annapolis Brass Quintet, and the Cleveland Classical Trio, among many ensembles devoted to new music. His *Trumpet Voluntary* and *Charles Wesley Organbook*, celebrating Bethany's 110th and 120th anniversaries, are published by Paraclete Press.

SECURITY RECOMMENDATION — The Board of Trustees, Pastor, and Church Office Administrator met on Wednesday, February 8, to discuss building security and the safety of staff, Bethany groups, and outside organizations using our facilities. While it was agreed that every effort should be made to ensure Bethany is a welcoming place for all, the Trustees recommended the following security measures be implemented immediately, <u>during the work week only</u>, for the protection of staff, our Bethany family, and visitors.

- 1. All outside doors, including the church office entrance, will remain locked during office hours (8am-4pm, Tuesday-Friday), for the protection of staff and volunteers. Signs will be posted advising visitors to call the church office if the door is locked upon arrival.
- 2. Individuals with church keys should use them to access the building as needed, but should relock the door after entering. It is not necessary to call the office first if you have a key.
- 3. Individuals without church keys are welcome during office hours but should call the church office upon arrival or before coming to the church, so staff can be on the lookout for you.
- 4. Bethany groups and civic organizations, particularly those meeting after hours, are encouraged to lock the outside doors once their meetings are in progress.

We feel these security measures will provide a safe and secure environment for our ministry staff, with minimal inconvenience to our Bethany family. These recommendations will not impact our regular Sunday morning worship and activities; outside doors will be unlocked on Sunday mornings. We appreciate your cooperation as we implement these new security measures. – Bethany Trustees
