Christian Home

May is Christian Home month in the United Methodist Church, a celebration of our home, as a gift of God, and of our family following Scriptural principles with Jesus Christ as the center of the family. While we celebrate this month, we remember our heritage as Methodists that we have cherished since the time of John Wesley.

"He provided a method of family worship—

Step 1: A short extemporaneous prayer.

Step 2: Psalm singing.

Step 3: Bible study. A parent was to read the scripture for the day and explain it. Then the children were to explain the Bible passage back to the parents.

Step 4: Family prayer using both written and spontaneous prayers.

Step 5: Singing of the Doxology.

Step 6: The Benediction given by a parent.

Step 7: The blessing. The parent lays his or her hand on the head of each child and blesses the child in Jesus' name. The blessing in Jesus' name, Wesley charged, was never to be omitted no matter how badly the child had behaved that day."

You can use Wesley's method of family devotion appropriately according to your family situation—single, married with or without children, on a daily or weekly basis. The goal is to help your family to live in awareness of the presence of Jesus Christ in your home.

John Wesley also provided A Collection of Prayers for Families, Prayers and Devotions for Every Day of the Week, Prayers for Children, Lessons for Children (two hundred Bible Studies) and Instruction for Children (fifty-eight lessons on Christian living).

Let Jesus Christ be the center of your home.



WORSHIP: What It Is and What It Isn't

One of the age-old debates in the Church centers around worship. Many people, myself included, have floated in and out of churches because the style of music wasn't familiar or what we expected. As I have grown in my walk with the Lord I have come to realize that worship is not really about music at all. Sure, we utilize music to offer praise to our deserving, loving, great, and glorious Lord, but worship is about so much more than music!

Singer-songwriter Matt Redman wrote his popular song, "The Heart of Worship," following a period of apathy within his home church in England. "There was a dynamic missing, so the pastor did a pretty brave thing," he recalls. "He decided to get rid of the sound system and band for a season, and we gathered together with just our voices. His point was that we'd lost our way in worship, and the way to get back to the heart would be to strip everything away. Before long, we reintroduced the musicians and sound system, as we'd gained a new perspective that worship is all about Jesus, and He commands a response in the depths of our souls no matter what the circumstance and setting. 'The Heart of Worship' simply describes what occurred."

When the music fades, all is stripped away, and I simply come Longing just to bring something that's of worth that will bless your heart... I'm coming back to the heart of worship, and it's all about You, Jesus

Jesus is looking for people who will worship Him in Spirt and in Truth, who recognize that worship is not just about music, but about service, sacrifice, and Bible-based living. How will you worship Him today?
