INTRODUCING BACH'S "GOLDBERG" VARIATIONS (Third Installment)

In his full, formal title, *Aria with Divers Variations, for the Harpsichord with Two Manuals, Composed for Music Lovers to Refresh their Spirits*, Bach is quite specific about the instrument required to perform this gigantic opus. The harpsichord is a stringed instrument, played from one or two keyboards (or manuals), which flourished in the 17th and 18th centuries – the so-called Baroque period of music history. While shaped like a grand piano, which replaced it in the 19th-century Romantic era, the harpsichord has a completely different technology and sound. Instead of hammers striking the piano's strings with percussive effect, the harpsichord employs quill plectra to pluck its strings, producing a *timbre* (or tone quality) akin to that of the lute, mandolin, or harp.

In some respects the "Goldberg" Variations stand as a tribute to the Italian composer Domenico Scarlatti. Born like Bach and Handel in 1685, Scarlatti wrote more than 500 sonatas for harpsichord, many of them scintillating virtuoso études that feature rapid scales, arpeggios, and repeated notes, and especially the crossing of hands. The first 30 sonatas were published in 1739, two years before the "Goldbergs," and in ten of his variations Bach exploits the advanced keyboard techniques that Scarlatti introduced: Nos. 1, 5, 8, 11, 14, 17, 20, 23, 26, and 28.

Several variations are one of a kind, standing outside of the aforementioned categories of canon, dance and étude. In No. 10, for example, Bach appears to be poking fun at a pompous academic, for he subtitles it *Fughetta* – a slighting reference to that most learned musical form, the fugue. By all accounts, Bach had a rather dry sense of humor. When asked for the recipe of his success as an organist, he quipped: "One simply presses the right key at the right time and the organ does the rest!"

Since Bethany does not possess a harpsichord, we are performing Bach's "Goldberg" Variations on the organ. In fact our Allen digital "organ" can replicate generic harpsichord tone, which will be mixed with traditional organ stops to create a kaleidoscopic panoply of sound appropriate to the character of each variation.
