A Blessed Church

We want our church to be blessed, don't we? What is a blessed church like?

Becoming a Blessed Church, written by N. Graham Standish, was one of the books that our church's Joshua Spiritual Formation Group has studied. Fourteen people faithfully met monthly for ten months, and they finished their journey successfully in August.

The author claims that a blessed church is a church formed by spiritual purpose, presence and power, is growing in spiritual awareness, awakening, and spiritual adventure so as to encounter God in the life of the church. Spiritual dimension and practice are the guiding principles for all mission and ministry programs and activities of the church.

He describes five marks of a blessed church:

—A blessed church sees itself as the body of Christ. The church is a body, not a business; an organism, not an organization.

- -A blessed church has a vibrant sense of faith, hope, and love.
- -A blessed church is filled with God's purpose, presence, and power.
- -A blessed church embraces the sacred.

-A blessed church is not afraid to serve God in its own way, responding to God's call and God's call alone. Each church has its own calling, ministry, and mission. Blessed churches resist the idea that they should do what others outside their situation demand, even if the hearts of the demanders are in the right place.

I really felt blessed reading this book with our Joshua Spiritual Formation Group members, thinking of our blessedness at Bethany church, and how we can become a more blessed church from now on.

"To be attentive to God, to what God is doing in and through Bethany church and respond to God faithfully" has been the focus of my pastoral ministry. Will you continue to pray and work alongside me for our church to become more blessed, as we continue to discern God's will, praying, "God, what are you calling us to be and to do?"
