

INTRODUCING BACH'S "GOLDBERG" VARIATIONS (TENTH INSTALLMENT)

Having reached Variation 25, we are now in the homestretch of our complete traversal of the monumental "Goldberg" Variations composed and published in 1741 by Johann Sebastian Bach.

Variation 25 has been called the "black pearl" of the set. Goethe, the great German poet, said that music begins where words leave off, and to describe this music as "sorrowful" or "tragic" contributes little to our appreciation of its incredible depth and richness. The American pianist Murray Perahia finds in it a portrayal of the Crucifixion. This opinion is fully justified on stylistic grounds, for in the "Crucified" section of his *Mass in B Minor* Bach employs the same extreme chromaticism (or notes outside of the prevailing tonality) to create the effect of hallucination caused by terrible suffering.

If Variation 25 is the "Crown of Thorns," Perahia interprets the last five variations as the "Resurrection." After the spiraling ascent of Variation 26, we are released from the bonds of gravity in No. 27 and 28, then whirled in the mighty tempest of No. 29, a bravura toccata.

Variation 30, the last of all, finds Bach with both feet planted on terra firma! It takes the form of a *quodlibet* (literally, "whatever you wish..."), a kind of musical tossed salad wherein various folksongs, often with humorous or naughty words, are all mixed up. Improvising such quodlibets was a favorite pastime at reunions of the Bach clan, so the greatest musician of the greatest musical dynasty is paying homage here to a family tradition. With his choice of texts — "Cabbage and turnips have driven me away" and "It's been so long since I was with you" — Bach also mocks his own ingenuity in disguising the simple song from wife Anna Magdalena's notebook almost beyond recognition. So it is fitting that the "Goldberg" Variations ends, as it began, with the Aria.
