



Slow down, Stop, Silence, and Solitude

The liturgical season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 14 when we offer worship service at 7:00PM, with ashes, a symbol of human mortality, repentance. This season comes to us as an opportunity to renew our faith in God through Jesus Christ.

When I was driving through my neighborhood, I noticed an inflatable, arm-waving figure known as a "tube man" or tube dancer which businesses use for advertising. It was at a restaurant which was newly opened, and whenever I drove by it, the tube man was always dancing, 24/7, as the fan blew air into it. It was a good idea, I think, to draw the attention of people, to advertise the restaurant.

At the same time, however, the tube man reminded me of our human condition, which is often a bit frenzied, dancing hard with no slowing down, driven by internal or external demands, or by the desire to achieve success. And we may lack meaningful rest deep down in our body, soul, and spirit, losing sight of our true self, who we are, and our purpose, why we are here, in the sight of God.

We are ushered into Lenten practices with worship, Scripture reading and meditation, acts of repentance, self-denial for the sake of others, following Jesus Christ who suffered and died for our sake. It is an opportunity to grow deep in faith as we slow down, stop, embracing silence and solitude for us to know God by experience.

"He says, be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth" (Psalm 46:10).



2023 YEAR END FINANCIAL UPDATE — With the prayers and generosity of the Bethany congregation and friends, the church's 2023 General Fund budget was met. Bethany was fortunate to receive two \$5,000 grants from the Mission Rivers District to help support Capital Projects. The Trustees submitted a grant to recondition and paint the church steeple. The Media Committee recognized the need for a grant to replace the broken speaker, located above the altar and to complete the sanctuary media desk.

In August, the Finance Committee started the process of developing the 2024 budget. Staff and Committee Chairpersons were asked to submit a narrative budget of their needs to complete their planned missions. The submitted information was reviewed and approved by both the Financial Committee and the Administrative Council. The 2024 approved budget resulted in an approximate 3% increase from the 2023 budget which partially reflects the 3% Pastor and Staff pay increase. Note, the Pastor and Staff haven't received a pay increase in the last four budget cycles.

The 2024 Bethany Budget is posted on the bulletin board outside the church office.
