The living and the dead.

The angels' message on the first Easter morning, according to the Gospel of Luke, can be summed up in one short sentence: "Do not look for the living among the dead" (Luke 24:1-12). What is the living and what is the dead?

Early in the morning, the women, Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and other women, went to the tomb where the body of Jesus was laid. They went there to keep their tradition of preparing the body which they had not been able to do earlier because Jesus was crucified on the evening when the Sabbath began and Sabbath rules prohibited this. So they went early in the morning of the first day after the Sabbath to anoint the body of Jesus, when the angels of God appeared to them, asking "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" The angels reminded the women of what Jesus had told them regarding his suffering and death on the cross, and his resurrection in three days. Then the women remembered Jesus' words.

The three women and others wanted to perform their duty, tradition, cleaning code of the law, anointing the body of Jesus whom they loved. But they were encountered by the good news that Jesus was risen from the dead, the living Lord.

Apostle Paul interpreted this story to the believers in Rome, "By dying to what once bound us, we have been released from the law so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit, and not in the old way of the written code" (Romans 7:6).

We can apply his teaching to us today this way. When we celebrate Easter just as a memorial, yearly celebration with much decoration and excitement, without encountering and inviting the risen Lord Jesus into our heart, mind and life, without letting him lead and guide us our life, then we do look for the living among the dead.

Jesus Christ is risen today. Let him be your living Lord.

Happy and blessed Easter.

MISSION TRIP TO HIGHER GROUND – May 12-18, 2024

Blue Ridge Christian Ministry has Higher Ground Christian Retreat center located off the Blue Ridge Parkway at Mile Post 190. The Retreat Center is a non-profit organization funded through donations and groups using the facility for camps, retreats and meetings. Higher Ground is situated on 73 acres on the top of a mountain overlooking the valley below. It is an ideal location for those looking to see God through nature and quiet meditation. The nearest town is 20 minutes away. Bethany's team will be working on building and grounds maintenance and construction items on the existing "Bethany Cottage" building.

Team members will need to bring comfortable work clothes and shoes, personal hygiene items, towels, and wash cloths. Team members will be staying in Fairview Lodge and Inn Agape. There is a dining hall/meeting building where meals will be prepared and eaten.

The trip will take approximately 6 hours by car. If you feel led to join the Bethany team on this mission trip, you will enjoy fellowship, nature's beauty, and feel the presence of God on the mountain top.
