

WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH: AMY BEACH, AMERICAN COMPOSER

Amy Beach was the first American woman to succeed as a composer of large-scale concert music.

She was born Amy Marcy Cheney on 5 September 1867 in West Henniker, New Hampshire, during an era when the world of work was divided into two distinct spheres: the public and professional for men, the private and domestic for women. In Europe the extraordinarily talented Fanny Mendelssohn set aside a creative career in favor of her brother Felix, as did Clara Schumann for her husband Robert. Despite her family's and society's lack of support, however, Amy Cheney knew even as a young child that "no other life than that of a musician could ever have been possible for me." In 1885, when she made her debut with the renowned Boston Symphony Orchestra, critics deemed her performance of Chopin's Second Piano Concerto "perfect."

Marriage at the age of eighteen to prominent Boston physician Henry Harris Aubrey Beach, twenty-five years her senior, changed Amy's career path. On Henry's insistence, and in keeping with her newly elevated social status, she limited her performances on the piano to a few charity concerts per year and – happily for posterity – devoted herself entirely to composition. In this field she was self-taught, yet she achieved remarkable success with works published under her married name, Mrs. H. A. Beach. Apart from many songs and piano pieces, her most significant works are the *Mass in E-flat*, the "Gaelic" *Symphony*, and the *Piano Concerto* which she herself premiered with the Boston Symphony in 1900.

Widowed at age 43, she went to Germany to present her compositions and revive her career as a pianist, under the name Amy Beach. On her triumphant return to Boston in 1914, she devoted herself to concert tours and composition, completing the balance of her three hundred works. Many were written at the MacDowell colony in Peterborough, New Hampshire, a rural retreat founded by the composer Edward MacDowell for artists, writers, and musicians to meet and create in peace and mutual inspiration. Conceived in that idyllic setting in 1921, *A Hermit Thrust at Morn* includes actual bird-calls, notated "in the original keys but an octave lower," as Amy Beach remarks in a footnote to the score.

Long a hero to women composers, Amy Beach died on 27 December 1944 in New York City at the age of seventy-seven.
