On March 19 during our monthly Administrative Council meeting, there was a discussion to evaluate the ministry of the Banner in light of newer technology that has become a part of normal life— new communication tools that work more effectively than hard copy printing, such as our weekly bulletins, bi-weekly congregational email blast, website, and Facebook page.

The Council voted to discontinue monthly publication of the Banner as of April, and to focus on communicating with the congregation electronically. This is the final issue of *Bethany Banner*. We will continue to send bi-weekly email announcements to the congregation, including birthdays and anniversaries, prayer concerns, and other information. Our weekly worship bulletin will continue to include printed announcements. For the time being, we will continue to make available hard copies of the monthly calendar, birthdays, and anniversaries for those who wish to pick them up, as well as to shut-in members who are currently receiving the bulletin by mail.

"The old has gone, the new has come" (Corinthians 5:17) is a phrase that not only applies to our spiritual life but also to our communication tools too. When we are united to be the church together in one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism, we are able to make this transition of communication a blessing for the life and mission and ministry of the church.

On March 19th, Bethany Administrative Board approved a recommendation by the Church and Society Committee to join a group called Jubilee of Churches. Jubilee is a group of 17 churches of all denominations in Gloucester County. The group is working cooperatively to help prevent homelessness.

Here's how it works: When a call for help comes into any of these churches, the person needing help will be directed to call GUEST. GUEST has a staff of four to vet callers. When the person is found eligible, the person's need will be delivered by email to all the churches involved. Each church will decide how much of the request they can supply. When the total is confirmed, a check is written by GUEST and given to the vendor (e.g., landlord/mortgage company, utilities provider, etc.). Each participating church puts aside an amount of money for these requests, such as the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. Bethany members can add to the fund by making regular contributions, memorials, etc. to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. Monies in the Pastor's Discretionary Fund will be used not only to help meet needs through Jubilee, but also give Bethany's pastor the flexibility to personally handle any needs of our church members, or handle more time-sensitive requests as needed.

Advantages of participating in Jubilee of Churches: 1) Removes the responsibility of benevolence screening and follow up correspondence from local church staff and places it with GUEST, which has knowledge of and access to a wider array of resources and services to provide help to those in need; 2) Helps ease frustration and stress for the applicants by reducing the number of calls they would typically make in order to receive the help they desperately need; and 3) Fosters a greater sense of community and cooperative ministry between the churches involved, providing greater opportunity for more effective ministry to those in need.

CHURCH OFFICE HOURS ARE CHANGING MAY 1

Beginning May 1, the church office will go back to a five-day schedule and will be open from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Currently the office is closed on Mondays. The S/PPRC recommended, and church leadership agreed, that this change would benefit the church and be effectively implemented as a new Church Office

The position is for thirty (30) hours per week, and the salary is based on previous administrative experience. Blue Ridge Christian Ministry has Higher Ground Christian Retreat center located off the Blue Ridge Parkway at Mile Post 190. The Retreat Center is a non-profit organization funded through donations and groups using the facility for camps, retreats and meetings. Higher Ground is situated on 73 acres on the top of a mountain overlooking the valley below. It is an ideal location for those looking to see God through nature and quiet meditation. The nearest town is 20 minutes away. Bethany's team will be working on building and grounds maintenance and construction items on the existing "Bethany Cottage" building.

Team members will need to bring comfortable work clothes and shoes, personal hygiene items, towels, and wash cloths. Team members will be staying in Fairview Lodge and Inn Agape. Each of these buildings has 6 rooms. Each room has 2 double beds, desk and chair, and a bathroom with shower or tub, toilet, and sink. There is a dining hall/meeting building where meals will be prepared and eaten.

The trip will take approximately 6 hours by car. If you feel led to join the Bethany team on this mission trip, you will enjoy fellowship, nature's beauty, and feel the presence of God on the mountain top.
